





How important are these resources?

- The majority of people responding indicated all of the parks and resources listed were "important" to "very important"
- 32.69% are "not familiar" with Archie Valleau Landing



How most people learn about the parks and recreation programs activities, and resources:







How often in the last 12 months have you used each resource:

- Most people indicate use between 1-10 times for all EXCEPT
 - Ballpark- 54.25% Never
 - Archie Valleau Landing 36.54% Never



Opinions on the overall condition and level of maintenance for each park:

- A majority of those responding believed the overall condition and level of maintenance for each township resource was average to excellent.
- Poor or below average combined was:
 - Coy Mountain- 18.42%
 - Ball Park- 24.08%
 - Public Road End Access- 16.03%





Level of agreement with each hypothetical action to improve the park system -

- The majority of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" with:
 - "Re-developing/upgrading existing parks to support a broader range of activities" (69.87%)
 - "Develop new trails" (64.74%)
- The majority of respondents "disagreed" or "strongly disagreed" with:
 - "No additional parks or changes to current resources are needed" (63.46%)
 - "Acquiring land for future parks and/or open spaces" (21.8%)



Supporting the development of a recreational trail system in Helena Township:

- 78% said yes
- 21% said no








Top 3 Trails with highest priority:

- 1. Paved trails for walking, biking, etc. 45.24%
- 2. Nature trails for viewing plants and wildlife 42.06%
- 3. Trails that link with other existing trails 41.27%





Under-served groups by the current recreation resources and/or programs:

- 40.77% of respondents believe "All groups are served adequately
- 28.46% believe "Seniors" are underserved
- 24.64% believe "People with disabilities" are underserved



Top 5 activities participated in:

- 1. Walking/Running/Hiking 70.47%
- 2. Swimming/Water Activities 67.79%
- 3. Kayaking/Boating 53.69%
- 4. Relaxing 53.69%
- 5. Picnic 40.94%





Top 5 recreation facilities/resources those would MOST like to see added:

- 1. Walking/Jogging Paths 60.81%
- Bike Paths/Trails 50.00%
- 3. Additional bathrooms/drinking fountains 30.41%
- More accessible facilities/resources for older people or people with disabilities – 27.03%
- 5. Additional benches 25.68%



Top 5 programs, classes or activities those would MOST like to see:

- 1. Outdoor concerts 49.65%
- 2. Aerobics, spinning, or fitness instruction/classes 27.97%
- 3. Science or nature classes 25.87%
- 4. Yoga, meditation, or stress relief classes 24.48%
- 5. Arts or crafts instruction or classes 20.98%
- *The results of this will be shared with the Helena Public Library for possible future planning



The most important priorities Helena Township Parks and Recreation should consider when providing services to residents -

- The majority chose:
 - "Protection of natural areas and the environment" (70%)
 - "Provide opportunities to enjoy nature/outdoors" (50.67%)






