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Community Description

This five-year recreational plan is for the jurisdiction of Helena Township. It was developed by the Parks and Recreation Committee in concert with and approved by the Helena Township Board. Our plan focuses on all matters relating to parks and recreation in our township currently and in the future.

Helena Township is located in the southwest part of Antrim County.

The Township is bounded by Kalkaska County on the south and Custer Township on the east. Torch Lake forms the western boundary while Clam Lake and the western portion of Grass River form a water boundary on the north.

Helena Township is one of the smallest townships in Antrim County. It is only 19.5 square miles as opposed to the usual 36.0 square miles for most townships.

According to the 2010 U.S. Census, there were 1,001 people living in Helena Township. Fifteen percent or 154 are under the age of 18 and 85 percent or 847 are over the age of 18. Of that last group 284 or 28 percent are age 50-64 and 302 or 30 percent are over the age of 65. The large population of older adults and its influence on our planning and goals and objectives will be discussed later in this document.

Commercial activity takes place in the Clam River area, the unincorporated village of Alden, and the southwest corner of the Township (Crystal Beach Road and South East Torch Lake Drive). The commercial activity that occurs in the Township is concentrated during the summer months.

Administrative Structure

The Township Planning Commission was established by the Helena Township Board under the authority of Public Act 157 passed in 1905. The purpose of the Helena Township Planning Commission is to oversee the orderly development of the township. It systematically reviews and revises the master plan and zoning ordinances. In addition, the Planning Commission researches pertinent land use topics and advises the Township Board on these issues.

The Helena Township Planning Commission encourages public participation through its advisory committees, regular public meetings, and public hearings. One of those committees is the Parks and Recreation Committee. That committee drafted the Parks and Recreation Plan for Helena Township, which was reviewed and approved by the Township Board. The Parks and Recreation Committee will advise and work with the township to implement the goals, objectives, and action steps in the plan.

Helena Township employs one part-time zoning administrator, one assessor, one maintenance person, and one seasonal maintenance person. The supervisor, clerk, treasurer and two trustees are paid elected officials.

The primary source of funding Parks and Recreation projects is an annual operating budget that is reviewed and approved by the Township Board. The community is very active and supportive through financial donations as well as donations of labor and materials for many smaller projects. Major projects such as Coy Mountain have been initiated through MDNRTF grants as well as community donations and volunteer labor.

The Helena Township Parks and Recreation budget consists of two main accounts. One account contains \$26,600 for the operation and maintenance of the following parks: Coy Mountain Preserve, Tennis Court Park, Depot Park, Archie Valleau Landing, Alden Safe Harbor, and the Helena Township Ball Park. The second account contains \$96,141 and is for the operation and maintenance of the Helena Township Community Center. Both these budgets can be supplemented from the general fund if capital improvements or repairs are necessary.

Helena Township is fortunate to have several active volunteer groups who invest in the Township. These groups have invested money and energy into improving and maintaining the Township parks and recreational activities. We acknowledge the past efforts of all groups that have worked to ensure recreational venues and activities for Helena Township residents as well as visitors. The Parks and Recreation Committee look forward to partnering with volunteer groups in future endeavors.

Helena Township and Parks and Recreation Committee have also developed working relationships with a number of government agencies. Before any project is undertaken, the Parks and Recreation Committee would discuss plans with any government or private group that is likely to become involved.

Inventory of Existing Parks, Natural Areas and Recreation Facilities

Helena Township has many parks that provide opportunities for varied types of recreation. Upkeep and renovation at all sites is restricted due to the limited amount of Township money available for this purpose.

The unincorporated village of Alden is the center of activity with the exception of two private marina complexes in the northern part of the Township where Clam River enters Torch Lake.

In addition to the major Township-owned facilities described below, the Township has located within its boundaries the Grass River Natural Area owned by Antrim County, thirteen (13) public lake access sites and three (3) public launch sites.

- Tennis Court Park was originally gifted to Helena Township by Hartley Comfort. It now has two fenced tennis courts which were renovated around 1988. There is a small covered pavilion with electrical outlets. Running water is also available. Permanent restrooms are available May through October. There is an extensive play area and varied equipment. Swings are in an area separate from the general play equipment. There is a concrete basketball court in the lower level of the park. The Township provides electricity and ongoing maintenance of the Park.
- Archie Valleau Landing is adjacent to the north side of the Alden Safe Harbor and is a small wedge-shaped piece of shore land that was donated to the Township for recreational purposes. As with several other parks in Helena Township, Archie Valleau Landing lacks accessibility by persons with disabilities. In fact, a concrete ledge approximately four to five inches high separates the paved parking area from the beach front. There is no opening at any point in this barrier. The parking lot adjacent to this park is paved but has no handicap only parking spaces. We believe that all parks in our township must be accessible. In our public survey 49% of respondents thought all groups were being served adequately, but of the remaining 51% over 15% thought people with disabilities were underserved.

When we asked in our public survey about routine park maintenance, 54% said they would like to see better maintenance of existing park facilities. Archie Valleau Landing offers one of the few sandy beaches on Torch Lake, but it would benefit from routine raking of the beach. Also, the port-apotties that serve both Archie Valleau Landing and the Alden Safe Harbor need an upgrade to make the area more attractive.

• Alden Safe Harbor provides the only public boat docks on Torch Lake. It is a designated safe harbor. In our public survey, Alden Safe Harbor was identified as the second most important resource in our township. Over 79%

of those who completed the survey listed Alden Safe Harbor as important to very important. And of that group, more than 30% said they used the harbor more than seven times each year with 50% using it one to six times.

Locating Alden Safe Harbor from a boat in the middle of Torch Lake can be difficult for those not familiar with the lake. This could be a safety issue in the event of dangerous weather. Our committee would like to establish a landmark to help boaters identify the entrance to the harbor.

When we asked in our public survey for suggestions to improve our parks, several people said they wanted improved signage about the features and attractions available in Helena Township. Since the Safe Harbor is an entry point for boaters visiting Alden, we believe improved signage and making the dock area more attractive would enhance the visitors' experience.

• **Depot Park** is a varied site, including a 1908 railroad depot with over three acres contiguous to Torch Lake. The depot was acquired in 1986, restored to its original appearance and is now the Alden Depot Museum, which has been designated as a state historical site. The Museum is open Friday through Sunday afternoons from Memorial to Labor Day. Renovation of the building provided public restrooms and barrier-free access, when the Museum is open. A caboose that can be explored by the public (during museum hours) and a train engine are located outside the Museum.

The Park has two sand volleyball courts, decking and steps for lake access. The Park has been landscaped and is maintained by volunteers, has viewing benches, picnic tables and grills.

The parking lot at Depot Park provides parking for the park, as well as boat trailer parking for people using the Alden Boat Launch.

The Township provides maintenance and electricity, takes care of cleanup and trash collection, and provides portable toilets for the season.

• Coy Mountain Forest Preserve began with land originally given by the Reuben Coy Family. The intent was to preserve and protect the landscape in all its natural beauty. The desire was to maintain the trees, shrubs, flowers, and wild life indigenous to this area for the use and benefit of the residents of Alden and the surrounding community. The original gift was supplemented with a donation by Harry Swan. In 2003 the Township, aided by a DNR recreations grant, acquired 2.7 acres of climax hardwood forest in the center of the existing 17 acres.

Trail development took place in several stages beginning in 1986 with members of the Youth Conservation Corps. The Alden Run Committee, local Boy Scouts, Traverse City Eagle Scout, Bob Pennington, and the Alden Volunteers all played a part in trail development and maintenance.

The trails are approximately 1.5 miles long with an elevation difference of 180 feet. A trailhead sign has been erected. Educational signs which identify unique trees are in place. Many large diameter red oak, sugar maple, beech, hemlock and basswood trees exist on the parcel. Coy Mountain is a place where people go to enjoy the natural beauty of a Northern Michigan forest.

- Community Center houses the Township offices and Alden District Library as well as a kitchen, meeting rooms, gymnasium, and public restrooms. The Community Center provides a location for a variety of indoor recreation and year-round social events including educational programs, movies, music, yoga, bingo, quilting, watercolor painting class, and mah jong.
- The Helena Township Ball Park is a recreational area and beach on Torch Lake approximately 6.2 acres in size. It is classified as a "Community Park" and is located on SE Torch Lake Drive and the southeast shore of Torch Lake. This park contains a ball field, dugout, permanent, concrete bleachers, concession building, port-a-potty, and Rubbermaid pump house.

There is a special use area of the park on the shoreline of Torch Lake. It contains steps leading down to the water bordered by a split rail fence at the top. This area contains three picnic tables, four barbeque grills, and two refuse barrels.

The baseball field is used by area little league teams. The shoreline area allows local residents and visitors to enjoy Torch Lake swimming and picnicking.

Currently many sections of this property are not being used because the focus is on the ball diamond and shoreline areas. This park could benefit from a professional land use planner.

Handicap accessibility at this park is very poor. The parking lot is not paved and there are no designated handicap parking spaces. There are no paved pathways within the park. Without a ramp or railings the bleacher section is not accessible. The port-a-potty is not handicap accessible.

There is no recreational grant associated with Helena Township Ball Park.


Inventory of Existing Parks, Natural Areas and Recreation Facilities


There are 13 road end lake accesses in Helena Township. Jurisdiction for these accesses was transferred from Antrim County to Helena Township in 2010 by Resolution No. 040810. These lake accesses are a valuable resource for our township. They allow both residents and visitors physical access to the three lakes in our township; Torch Lake, Clam Lake, and Thayer Lake. A short description of each access is given below:

- 1. (A) Union Street: located off N. Lake St.
- 2. (B) Tyler Street: located off N. Lake St.
- 3. (C) Helena Street: located at the west end of Helena Street, bordered by Archie Valleau Landing and the Alden Safe Harbor on Torch Lake.
- 4. (D) Franklin Street: located at the west end of Franklin Street and gives access to Torch Lake.
- 5. <u>(E) Un-named access</u>: located on South Lake Street with access to Torch Lake
- 6. <u>(F) Crystal Springs Road</u>: located at the 90 degree turn of Crystal Springs Rd. (near Green St.) giving access to Clam Lake.
- 7. (G) Chapman Road: located at the end on Chapman Rd. allows access to Clam Lake.
- 8. <u>(H) Lone Tree Point</u>: located west of S. East Torch Lake Dr. gives access to Torch Lake.
- 9. (I) Un-named road access: located on the northwest side of Thayer Lake.
- 10. (J) Paige Road: located at the west end of Paige Rd. and allows access to Torch Lake.
- 11. (K) N. Lake Street: located off S. East Torch Lake Dr. accessed by Best St, right onto Pere Marquette to the end and left onto Lake Street access. It gives access to Torch Lake.
- 12. (L) Best Street: located off S. East Torch Lake Dr. allows access on Torch Lake.
- 13. (M) Elder Road: located at the west end of Elder Rd. and allows access to Torch Lake.





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RESOURCE INVENTORY

Helena Township residents strongly agree that acquiring land for future parks and/or open space is an action that will improve the park system. The Township will continue to evaluate land acquisition opportunities and will work with willing landowners and other public and private partners to acquire land that meets parks and recreation needs.

Based on the results of our public survey and input from other business and stakeholder groups, we have determined that the most desirable lands for acquisition would be the following:

- 1. Waterfront property on Torch Lake, Clam River, Thayer Lake and Spencer Creek.
- 2. Property contiguous with our existing parks which allow for expansion of those parks.
- 3. Scenic viewshed property.

Waterfront property on Torch Lake, Clam River, Thayer Lake and Spencer Creek

We have identified several pieces of property in the vicinity of the Alden Safe Harbor that may be available for acquisition in the near future. Currently, these parcels are owned by the Alden State Bank. One parcel is contiguous to the Alden Safe Harbor and has frontage on Torch Lake. The others are connected to that parcel. Together, they would make a wonderful picnic area for the public and boaters to use. The description for these parcels is as follows:

In addition, there is one parcel located directly across the street (Coy St.) from those listed above that offers frontage on Spencer Creek. It is also owned by the Alden State Bank. The description for this parcel is as follows:

<u>Property contiguous with our existing parks which allow for expansion of those parks</u>

Our committee has identified four pieces of property that border the Coy Mountain Preserve and, if acquired, would allow for a substantial expansion of that park. These parcels contain no buildings and are partially wooded. They are all privately owned but may be on the market in the near future.

Scenic viewshed property

Our committee also identified a 63 acre parcel located approximately one-half mile east of Alden that offers a wonderful view of Alden and Torch Lake. It contains an old barn but no other buildings and is partially wooded. It is large enough for the development of trails and/or picnic areas. This parcel is currently owned privately but may be available for purchase in the near future. The description for this parcel is:

DESCRIPTION OF THE PLANNING AND PUBLIC INPUT PROCESS

Planning Methods:

A systems approach to planning was utilized in the construction of our five year plan. The first step for our Parks and Recreation Committee was to review the Guidelines for the Development of Community Park, Recreation, Open Space, and Greenway Plans provided by the DNR. We also reviewed the previous five year plan which was completed in 2004 to cover the period 2004-2008. We then conducted a physical inventory of the existing parks and recreation facilities by touring each park and documenting their content, features, and positive and negative attributes. We also interviewed people who use these facilities, including library workers, township officials and members of the general public.

In October of 2011 we conducted a survey of Helena Township's full-time and part-time residents to obtain demographic information, and determine their likes and dislikes about existing parks. We also asked about their wishes for future development of existing or additional parks, and their priorities related to this process. The public survey is described in detail below.

In April of 2012, a meeting was held with volunteer groups in Helena Township to review the findings of our public survey, advise them that we are developing a new five year plan and to obtain their input. Attending that meeting were representatives from the Juniper Garden Club, Alden Volunteers, Downtown Alden Business Association, Alden Historical Society, and Friends of the Library. Several of these groups have been instrumental in the development, maintenance, and beautification of our parks.

Our five year plan focuses on the features in our parks, natural areas, and facilities which we identified as needing improvement based on our observations, discussions with other stakeholders, and the information obtained through the public input process.

Public Input Process:

In addition to the onsite survey of each park and facility by the Parks and Recreation Committee, and the meeting with Helena Townships volunteer groups; we also conducted a comprehensive survey of Helena Township's property owners, residents, and visitors. Our goal was to obtain their insights and priorities as we work to develop a new five year plan. The survey was conducted as follows.

Description of the Public Planning and Input Process

In October of 2011 we mailed informational postcards to every property owner/tax payer in Helena Township. This totaled 1,030 postcards, of which 18 were undeliverable for a total of 1,012 delivered. The postcards notified taxpayers that the Helena Township Parks and Recreation Committee was conducting a survey during the period October 1 - 31. Residents were given three ways to complete the survey. They could pick up a copy of the survey at the Helena Township Community Center, go online at www.helenatownship.com and complete an electronic survey, or they could download a copy at the same website and mail or drop it off at the community center.

In addition, advertisements about the survey were placed in the two main newspapers that serve our township, and 30 flyers were posted around this and surrounding communities. Members of the Parks and Recreation Committee also made personal contacts to encourage residents to complete the survey.

A total of 221 people responded to the survey (a 22% response rate) as follows:

- 191 responded to the survey using the online tool
- 30 responded to the survey via hard copy

In addition to the survey, a public forum was held in November of 2011 to review the survey results and obtain any additional input from those in attendance.

Based on the number of people who responded to the survey and attended the public forum and our stakeholders meeting, our committee believes we have gathered input from the entire community, including residents of all ages, and members of community organizations.

A copy of the survey, forum agenda, and a summary of the survey findings can be found in the Appendix.

Public Input About the Plan:

Our Draft Five Year Plan was completed on June 4, 2013. On June 13, 2013 we placed a notice about the availability of our draft plan and a request for comments on the Helena Township bulletin board in the Community Center and in the two main newspapers that serve our township.

This notice informed readers they could view our draft plan two ways:

- 1. Review a hard copy of the plan at the Alden District Library.
- 2. Go online to the Helena Township Parks and Recreation website, www.helenatownship.com then click on "Draft Parks and Recreation Plan" .

Our committee gave residents three ways to comment on the draft plan:

- 1. Mail comments to the Helena Township Parks and Recreation Committee
- 2. Email comments to the committee at helena@torchlake.com
- 3. Bring their comments to a public meeting held July 16, 2013

Residents were given a one-month window, June 13 – July 16, to review the plan and submit comments.

Summary of the Comments Received:

Four Helena Township residents gave us written input about the Five-Year Plan and two residents offered verbal comments at our July 16 public meeting. Many of the comments were complimentary about the work the committee had done and supported the goals and objectives outlined in the plan. Several, however, targeted other issues that were not addressed directly in the plan. The specific issue and the action our committee is taking to address it are listed in the following paragraphs. Issue: Currently there is not a method available to enforce order at our township parks. Recently I called the police to respond to loud noise after closing time for the park and they said they will not enforce local ordinances that govern our parks. The township should not improve our parks in an effort to bring in more people until steps are taken to enforce ordinances and rules we have now.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: It is essential that swim areas [in our parks] be designated throughout the township where markers and buoys assure swimmers of a safe area and where boats are never allowed.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: I am a regular user of Coy Mountain and it is truly a wonderful resource for our community. I...have noticed this summer the undergrowth beneath the large trees along Valley Street where the half-circle drive provides ingress and egress by car to the trailhead is making it impossible to see oncoming cars from the west when pulling out at the east end of the lot.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: I reviewed the inventory information related to the Alden Baseball Park [Helena Township Ball Park] in the plan. In approximately 2001 there was some discussion about changing the land use at this park. I recall from the discussions deed restrictions are in place from the original land donations

by the Aemisegger and Chapelle families. I think further research is required on the part of the committee to confirm what deed restrictions exist to include the information in the inventory.

- The committee has obtained copies of all deeds related to the parks in Helena Township. It will review these deeds at a future committee meeting in order to determine what restrictions (if any) exist.

Issue: The Ball Park [Helena Township Ball Park] ...is an area of concern. The ball park is great for baseball, picnics, and swimming. We enjoy hearing and watching the adults and children in the water and the occasional ballgame. However, it has recently become a second "Sand Bar". Someone usually anchors their boat there most of the summer. Sometimes there is also another one anchored. We don't know what the rules are, but it doesn't seem like a good idea.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: The survey conducted in 2011 indicated that Helena Township residents were most interested in walking/jogging paths (57%) and bike paths and trails (55%). Except for the identification of additional property in the Coy Mt. Trail area and a scenic overlook area, this draft does not appear to address the major wishes identified by the respondents in the township.

- The committee believes that these issues are already addressed in the plan. The acquisition of additional property contiguous to Coy Mountain Preserve and view-shed property will lead to additional walking/jogging paths and perhaps bike paths if the terrain is not too hilly. In addition, accessible pathways within both Depot Park and Helena Township Ball Park will increase the number of walking paths available for residents.

Issue: I am guarded about more paving that can lead to increase storm water runoff in the various parks especially at Valleau Landing [Archie Valleau Landing] and the Ballpark [Helena Township Ball Park]. A paved path to the water's edge is a direct path for storm water and all it carries with it to the lake. In San Diego on the beaches large plastic-like squares with large holes are pieced together to allow wheelchair access across the soft sand to the hardback sand near the water's edge. I also would prefer not to see paving at the Coy Mt. Trailhead [Coy Mountain Preserve]. Please research alternative surfaces from paving that are more pervious to rainwater especially on slopes and near the lake. Adding sand and raking the beach are two items I fear may alter the natural environment...

- The committee believes this an excellent point regarding the unintended side effects of building pathways at any of our parks. As stated under action/program steps whenever we discuss constructing pathways, we would consult with disability specialists and environment experts before beginning any of these projects.

Issue: If the Township intends to set a goal and /or prioritize land acquisition that reflects the values represented by the survey responses, you [Parks and Recreation Committee] might want to consider adding some language in the recreation plan that states that goal.

- The committee agrees with this suggestion and has revised the plan under the section titled **RESOURCE INVENTORY** to reflect this.

GOALS, OBJECTIVES, AND ACTION STEPS:

On the following pages in a grid format, we have stated our goals, objectives, and action steps for each park. A paragraph that provides support for the goals and objectives we used is included before each park's grid.

The goals we arrived at for the Helena Township Parks and Recreation 5-year-plan are based on information obtained from our extensive survey of the residents, the public meeting held to discuss the survey results, our meeting with stakeholder groups, our contacts with people who use the parks and facilities, and observations and data collected by committee members. They are:

- Promote a healthier and safer community for all age groups
- Develop age appropriate recreational opportunities within Helena Township
- Improved communication for residents and visitors about Helena Township parks and recreation facilities and activities
- Improved access at all Helena Township Parks
- Protection/preservation of natural areas and the environment
- Unify the visual statement made by signage, landscaping, equipment, paint colors, and style of any modifications or other new buildings at the parks

TENNIS COURT PARK

Accessibility and Safety:

Helena Township includes a large percentage of the population who are middle age to seniors. Census figures for 2010 state that 59% of our population is over age 50. Sixty percent of the people who responded to our public survey were age 55 or over. We believe that all the parks in our township must be accessible and safe for people in these age groups, regardless of their mobility challenges.

When we surveyed our parks for accessibility by the handicapped or disabled, only three were accessible, including Tennis Court Park. The Tennis Court Park has one handicap parking space and accessible bathrooms, but no access to the play ground equipment and surrounding area, the swings, the tennis courts, the pavilion, or the basketball court. In fact, the only paved pathway leads from the parking lot to the restrooms. The basketball court in this park is located on a lower level of the park which is approximately 12 to 15 feet below the main level. Currently, the only way to access the court is to walk down the steep and eroded hillside, or walk out to the two-track road which goes down to that level. Also, the hillside between the two levels contains a large quantity of poison ivy which is a hazard to those using the park. Our committee believes that improving accessibility and safety in Tennis Court Park must be a major priority.

Healthier community with recreational opportunities for all age groups:

Fifteen percent of our residents are under the age of 18 and 25% are between 18 and 49 years old according to 2010 census data. In our public survey, 14% of those responding were 19 years old or younger, and 25% were between 20 and 54. Over 70% of survey respondents said that Tennis Court Park is an important to very important resource. In addition, over 61% said they supported upgrading existing parks and 54% said they would like to see better maintenance of existing parks. When we asked which groups were underserved by our current recreation resources and programs, 49% said all groups are served adequately. However, of the remaining 51% over 19% answered seniors, 17% stated high school youths, and 15% believed people with disabilities were underserved. Both those responding to our public survey and those who attended our public meeting to discuss the survey results indicated a desire to have play equipment for infants and toddlers available at Tennis Court Park. We believe that it is important to provide safe recreational opportunities for all age groups by improving the basketball courts, reconditioning the tennis courts, and providing playground opportunities for families with toddlers.

Uniformity of themes and styles in parks:

One of the goals for the Parks and Recreation Department of Helena Township as stated in their master plan is to unify the visual statement made by signage, landscaping, paint colors, and style of modifications or new buildings at our parks. Currently there is no coordinated effort to do this so our committee believes we must begin this process by including it in the 5-year-plan.

Archie Valleau Landing

As with several other parks in Helena Township, Archie Valleau Landing lacks accessibility by persons with disabilities. In fact, a concrete barrier approximately 4 to 5 inches high separates the grassy area from the beach front. There is no opening at any point in this barrier. The parking lot adjacent to this park is paved but has no handicap only parking spaces. We believe that all parks in our township must be accessible. In our public survey, 49% of respondents thought all groups were being served adequately, but of the remaining 51%, over 15% thought people with disabilities were underserved.

When we asked in our public survey about routine park maintenance, 54% said they would like to see better maintenance of existing park facilities. Archie Valleau Landing offers one of the few sandy beaches on Torch Lake, but it could benefit from routine raking of the beach. Also, the Port-a-Potties that serve both Archie Valleau Landing and the Alden Safe Harbor need an upgrade to make the area more attractive.

Alden Safe Harbor

Alden Safe Harbor provides the only public boat docks on Torch Lake. In our public survey, Alden Safe Harbor was identified as the second most important resource in our township. Over 79% of those who completed the survey listed Alden Safe Harbor as important to very important. And of that group, more than 30% said they used the harbor more than 7 times each year with 50% using it one to six times.

Locating Alden Safe Harbor from a boat in the middle of Torch Lake can be difficult for those not familiar with the lake. This could be a safety issue in the event of dangerous weather. Our committee would like to erect a structure to help boaters identify the entrance to the harbor.

When we asked in our public survey for suggestions to improve our parks, several people said they wanted improved signage about the features and attractions available in Helena Township. Since the Safe Harbor is an entry point for boaters visiting Alden, we believe improved signage and making the dock area more attractive would enhance the visitor's experience.

Helena Township Depot Park (Chessie's Pause)

Accessibility and Safety:

Depot Park was referenced by 88% of survey respondents as important or very important to this community. Nearly one third (28%) used the park more than 7 times in a year, and nearly two thirds (62%) indicated that they visited 1-6 times annually. Only 9% said that they never visited the park. As the most used facility in Helena Township, concerns about safety and accessibility must be taken very seriously. At present, there are few measures taken to ensure access for the disabled.

Since our local population is predominantly aged 50+, the park must be revised to include those with mobility issues. Pathways to the observation decks at the southwest corner of the park and the brick platform in front of the depot building must be upgraded to allow those in wheelchairs or motorized scooters to access these areas without danger of getting stuck or turning over. There should be a hardscaped handicapper access to the brick platform from the south end, as well as a renovated path next to the Herb Garden so that those who cannot walk can still enjoy these facilities. The Alden Depot Museum, located inside the building, has some mitigation for accessibility, but that facility should be evaluated for better access. Finally, the parking lot should have some spaces designated for handicapped parking.

Healthier Community:

There are concerns that the facility could be better used if some planning were done to provide more opportunities for recreation. While the park is used for private gatherings, some thoughtful planning might open up some concepts that would increase the parks utility as a recreational source.

Improved Communication:

There are several problems that emerge as a result of overlapping organizations that use the facility. The Helena Township Historical Society administers the museum and holds some standing events each year. Private individuals also use the park for events, and several local nonprofits also hold various events there. Increased publicity and awareness campaigns could improve the cluttered schedule.

Uniformity of Themes and Styles:

Over the years, various styles of seating and picnic tables and grills have been added to the park, and because of multiple uses, the seating often gets moved around for rental tents and other issues.

It may be wise to reconsider the kinds of seating that are used there, although the budget might not be able to cover replacement. Signage indicating hours of use and other commonsense rules would be helpful.

COY MOUNTAIN PRESERVE

In our public survey, over 67% of respondents said that Coy Mountain Preserve is important to very important to their family. Over 9% said they have used the facility more than 7 times during the past year, and over 53% said they have used it 1 to 6 times. Clearly Coy Mountain Preserve is a valuable asset in our community.

One of the features lacking at Coy Mountain is accessibility for disabled persons. The parking area is uneven, unpaved and has no handicap parking spaces. The trails are dirt, narrow and uneven. Parts of the park are extremely hilly and could not be used by wheelchairs. However, other trails offer modest elevation changes and could easily be adapted to be handicap accessible. One of the questions in our public survey asked, "If you support the development of a trail system, what type of trail(s) should have the highest priority in Helena Township?" 48.7% supported "paved trails for walking, biking, etc."

Ensuring the safety of those using Coy Mountain Preserve is a most urgent priority for our committee. One item that needs attention is the welcome sign at the entrance to the park. It has not been updated since the most recent trail was added and does not accurately indicate all trails available for hiking. This is both an information issue and a safety issue.

Several respondents to our survey stated they would like to see improved upkeep and maintenance to enhance the safety of those using this park. We need to shorten the interval of routine maintenance for the park to be sure that hazards such as fallen trees are removed immediately.

Several privately owned vacant parcels of land border Coy Mountain Preserve. Expanding the park by purchasing these properties would add to the overall experience of those using the park. In our public survey over 49% of respondents stated they agreed/strongly agreed with the action of the township "acquiring land for future parks and/or open spaces." Also, over 61% said they support redeveloping/upgrading existing parks to support a broader range of activities and over 57% said they agree/strongly agree with the township developing new trails.

Our committee believes Coy Mountain Preserve is a wonderful resource for our township and the village of Alden. It offers a trail hiking experience within walking distance of the downtown and lake front areas.

HELENA TOWNSHIP COMMUNITY CENTER

The Helena Township Community Center was rated as "very important" by over 78% of our survey responders and was considered to be in "average to excellent" condition. Over 60% of the township residents responding to our survey are 55 years of age or older, and almost half of the survey responders use the Community Center more than seven times a year. Although it wasn't brought out in the survey we have to note that the gymnasium is also used almost daily by senior citizens for walking, by young children for running and playing, and by teens and young adults for playing basketball. When considering the survey information, and also observing the daily use of the Community Center, our committee feels it is important to bring this aging building up to modern standards as regards handicap accessibility and providing a safe, comfortable place for our residents and visitors.

The Antrim County recycling bins are a welcome addition to the community. However, the area around the bins is unpaved, uneven and rutted. We feel that paving this area and making the driveway around the exterior of the building safer is important.

Helena Township Ball Park

In our public survey, 49% of respondents thought all groups were being served adequately. However, of the remaining 51%, over 15% thought people with disabilities were underserved. The Helena Township Ball Park parking lot is not paved and there are no handicap parking spaces. In addition, there are no paved pathways within the park. Our committee believes that all parks in our township must be accessible for those with disabilities. One of our goals for this park is a paved parking area with designated handicap spaces, and a paved path to the water front and an accessible observation platform.

Input from our public survey revealed that families with children wanted a park with permanent restrooms, a covered pavilion, a sandy beach area, and a designated swimming area with buoys. With so much frontage on Torch Lake and 6.2 acres, Helena Township Ball Park would be a perfect location for this. The 2010 Census revealed that 40% of people living in Helena Township are under the age of 50. In our public survey over 39% of those responding were under the age of 55. Since such a large percentage of our population may include families with children, we believe this goal must be a priority for our committee.

<u>Information from monthly Helena Twp. Mtg.</u>:

The policing ordinance that the HT Board approved concerning no overnight mooring at Alden Safe Harbor will go into effect Sept. 8th. A revision of the memorandum of understanding concerning the Veteran's Memorial is being requested as the Township will not be participating in sharing the initial costs of the memorial.

OLD BUSINESS:

Review of Public Input about the 5-year plan and discussion of any needed changes to the plan.

Summary of Comments Received:

The below information was written up by Steve Dell and will be included in the 5-year plan. It summarizes the decisions made during this August meeting.

Four Helena Township residents gave us written input about our 5-year-plan and 2 residents offered verbal comments at our July 16 public meeting. Many of the comments were complimentary about the work the committee had done and supported the goals and objectives outlined in the plan. Several however targeted other issues that were not addressed directly in the plan. The specific issue and the action our committee is taking to address it are listed in the following paragraphs.

Issue: Currently there is not a method available to enforce order at our township parks. Recently I called the police to respond to loud noise after closing time for the park and they said they will not enforce local ordinances that govern our parks. The township should not improve our parks in an effort to bring in more people until steps are taken to enforce ordinances and rules we have now.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: It is essential that swim areas [in our parks] be designated throughout the township where markers and buoys assure swimmers of a safe area and where boats are never allowed.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: I am a regular user of Coy Mountain and it is truly a wonderful resource for our community. I...have noticed this summer the undergrowth beneath the large trees along Valley Street where the half-circle drive provides ingress and egress by car to the trailhead is making it impossible to see oncoming cars from the West when pulling out at the East end of the lot.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: I reviewed the inventory information related to the Alden Baseball Park [Helena Township Ball Park] in the plan. In approximately 2001 there was some discussion about changing the land use at this park. I recall from the discussions deed restrictions are in place from the original land donations by the Aemisegger and Chapelle families. I think further research is required on the part of the committee to confirm what deed restrictions exist to include the information in the inventory.

- The committee has obtained copies of all deeds related to the parks in Helena Township. It will review these deeds at a future committee meeting in order to determine what restrictions (if any) exist.

Issue: The Ball Park [Helena Township Ball Park] ...is an area of concern. The ball park is great for baseball, picnics, and swimming. We enjoy hearing and watching the adults and children in the water and the occasional ballgame. However, it has recently become a second "Sand Bar". Someone usually anchors their boat there most of the summer. Sometimes there is also another one anchored. We don't know what the rules are, but it doesn't seem like a good idea.

- This issue is currently being addressed by the Helena Township Board. For this reason the committee will not include it in the plan.

Issue: The survey conducted in 2011 indicated that Helena Township residents were most interested in walking/jogging paths (57%) and bike paths and trails (55%). Except for the identification of additional property in the Coy Mt. Trail area and a scenic overlook area, this draft does not appear to address the major wishes identified by the respondents in the township.

The committee believes that these issues are already addressed in the plan. The acquisition of additional property contiguous to Coy Mountain Preserve and view shed property will lead to additional walking/jogging paths and perhaps bike paths if the terrain is not too hilly. In addition, accessible pathways within both Depot Park and Helena Township Ball Park will increase the number of walking paths available for residents.

Issue: I am guarded about more paving that can lead to increase storm water runoff in the various parks especially at Valleau Landing [Archie Valleau Landing] and the Ballpark [Helena Township Ball Park]. A paved path to the water's edge is a direct path for storm water and all it carries with it to the lake. In San Diego on the beaches large plastic like squares with large holes are pieced together to allow wheelchair access across the soft sand to the hardback sand near the water's edge. I also would prefer not to see paving at the Coy Mt. Trailhead [Coy Mountain Preserve]. Please research alternative surfaces from paving that are more pervious to rainwater especially on slopes and near the lake. Adding sand and raking the beach are two items I fear may alter the natural environment...

- The committee believes this an excellent point regarding the unintended side effects of building pathways at any of our parks. As stated under action/program steps whenever we discuss constructing pathways, we would consult with disability specialists and environment experts before beginning any of these projects.

Issue: If the Township intends to set a goal and /or prioritize land acquisition that reflects the values represented by the survey responses, you [Parks and Recreation Committee] might want to consider adding some language in the recreation plan that states that goal.

- The committee agrees with this suggestion and will revise the plan under the section titled **RESOURCE INVENTORY** to reflect this.

OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

Review name of our plan. Make changes if required so Plan name and name in resolution to the board match.

The name decided upon for the Five Year Plan was **Helena Township Recreation & Natural Resource Plan.**This will be on the plan and the resolution to be approved by the Helena Township Board.
Review plan for completeness:

Helena Township Parks and Recreation Plan

The plan was reviewed & all present voted to approve the plan as amended at this meeting. The final copy is to be presented to the Helena Township Board for a decision on Thursday, Sept. 12th.

Review memo regarding acquiring jurisdiction over Valley St. access which was sent to board.

Dave said that the memo was received but he is not aware if there was any action taken concerning the memo. **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Potential new committee member Tim Fox. Tim expressed an interest in serving on the Pks and Rec. Comm. Tim responded to an email sent by Ruth stating he was not able to meet during the day most of the year. He did not respond to the follow up email saying that the committee could discuss a possible meeting time that was compatible to everyone if he joined.
- 2. List Tina Fields as being a member of the HT Parks and Recreation Committee in recognition of her contributions. The Committees appreciation for Tina's help with typing and formatting the 5-year plan was unanimous. It was decided that we would be sure to say a public thank you on the HT Website. (Ruth)

A thank you note will also me sent. (Ruth)

- 3. Casey McDowell is still listed as committee member. The HT website still shows Casey as the Committee chair. Action required? It was decided that after the Five Year Plan is (hopefully) approved a copy will be sent to Casey with a thank you email.
